DB Schenker and the International Paralympic Committee extend partnership through to 2020

ESSEN: September 27, 2017. DB Schenker has extended its agreement with the International Paralympic Committee (IPC) to provide logistics, courier services, freight forwarding and customs clearance services for a number of IPC events, including upcoming Paralympic Games, until the end of 2020.

Under the terms of the new agreement DB Schenker will support the IPC for the Pyeong Chang 2018 and Tokyo 2020 Paralympic Games and other events, while the IPC will look to offer DB Schenker's services to a number of Local Organising Committees, broadcasters and IPC members.
